What is your favorite beer style to brew/drink? Classic American Pils (pre-prohibition). I like to brew that most because you can't find it at many breweries/pubs.

When did you start brewing and what was the first beer you brewed? I started in 1973, right after it became legal to homebrew in Minnesota. I started brewing more seriously in 1992, after moving to Oregon and a home with more room to brew.

What would be your ultimate beer-related vacation? Starting in Belgium, then going to Czechoslovakia, and finishing in Germany.

Tell me something about yourself that most HOTV'ers don't know. I am building a scale model of the Rogue River in my backyard. Most people think I am crazy, I am using concrete to channel the water.

Our club has brew gear that is available for members to use. All of the items reside at Corvallis Brewing Supply. If you check out a piece of club equipment, please clean and return it to Corvallis Brewing Supply as soon as possible for other members to use. There is a one week check out limit unless pre-arranged with the equipment dude...that would be me.

- RIMS (Recirculating Infusion Mash System) Due to the tenacity of this piece of equipment I would strongly suggest that you have a training brew session with someone who has experience in using it.
- Motorized Grain Mill
- CO₂ kit - Includes CO₂ bottle, regulator and tool box full of draft parts
- Oxygen Bottle and Infusion Stone
- Counter Pressure Bottle Filler
- Low-Pressure Burner with tank
- 12 gallon Stainless Steel Liquor Tank
- 15 gallon Stainless Steel Mashtun / Lautertun
- Bench Capper
- 10 gallon Cornelious Keg
- AHA Style Guidelines Books 1-8
